We are going to read part of a letter that the prophet Jeremiah sent to God's people who were in exile in Babylon.



Before you read...

Have you heard the story of Daniel in the Lion's Den? Today's reading is about the same guy—Daniel! We are going to read about a time in his life before the lion's den.

- The book of Daniel was written while God's people were in exile in Babylon.
- The prophet, Daniel, was one of the many people who had to leave Jerusalem and live in Babylon under the rule of King Nebuchadnezzar.
- The king wanted some Israelite men to come and serve him. He would treat these men better than all of the other Israelites.

Read Daniel 1:3-5

Look at verse 4. List three of the features the king wanted to see in the young Israelite men.

Where did the food for the men come from?

What kind of food do you think would be at a king's table?

Session 2 Tuesday

Before you read...



Remember, Daniel and his friends were God's people who were living in exile in Babylon.

The king's chief official chose Daniel and his three friends as some of the young men who were to be trained to serve the king of Babylon. The chief official changed Daniel's name to Belteshazzar. We will still call him Daniel.

• God had very specific rules about what His people could eat. The food from the king's table did not follow God's rules.

Read Daniel 1:8-10


Look at verse 8. What did Daniel decide NOT to do?

- God was with Daniel and caused the king's chief official to show favor and compassion to Daniel.
- But, the chief official was afraid that the king would kill him if Daniel did not eat the king's food.




Bonus Session l Wednesday

 King Darius did not worship the One True God, but he still thought God might rescue Daniel. Do you think King Darius might decide to worship God after this?

Read verse 17 again. Can you think of another time when a stone was rolled in front of a tomb and sealed?

Before you read...

Daniel and his friends were healthier than the other men who ate the king's food.

 God blessed them with knowledge and understanding because they obeyed Him.

 Remember, all of the men were supposed to train for three years to serve the king.

Read Daniel 1:18-20

At the end of the three years of training, did the king find any young men who were better than Daniel and his three friends?

In fact, the king said Daniel and his three friends were 10 times better than who...?

• Who made Daniel and his friends so great? Why did He make them great?


Bonus Session I Tuesday

 The other leaders and rulers did not like that Daniel would be in charge over them.



Before you read...

Yesterday we read that King Belshazzar was misusing God's special gold and silver goblets from His temple and was worshiping other gods.

This happened at a great banquet with more than a thousand people. Something pretty crazy happens next!

Read Daniel 5:5-9

How did the king react when he saw the human hand writing on the wall?

Who do you think was writing the message on the wall?

Look at verse 7. Who did the king ask to explain the message? Could they explain it?

Do you have a guess of who will be able to explain the message?

Session 3 Wednesday

Before you read...

Yesterday we read about a human hand that wrote a message on the wall at King Belshazzar's banquet. No one could understand the message.

But, the queen came to the king and said, "Hey, there is this guy named Daniel, who King Nebuchadnezzar appointed as a chief because he is really smart and can interpret dreams and understand riddles."

Read Daniel 5:13-16

Look at verse 14. What abilities did the king say Daniel had?

Who gave Daniel those abilities?

Daniel honored God no matter what. Even the king and queen, who didn't worship God, could see that Daniel was special. God gives each of us gifts and abilities to use to honor Him. What gifts or abilities do you have that you could use to honor God? (This is a deep thinking question!! Ask your parents what they think!)



Before you read...

God sent the prophets to tell His people about Jesus, His birth, His life, His death, and His resurrection.

- Today we are going back to Isaiah to read what he wrote about Jesus' death and resurrection. Remember, Isaiah wrote this about 700 years before Jesus was born.
- God's plan has always been for us to be with Him. Our sin keeps us away, but Jesus' death and resurrection made it possible for us to be with Him forever!

Read Isaiah 5:5, 10-11

- Look at verse 5. How are we healed?
- Look at verse 11. What happens after Jesus' suffering?
- How does it make you feel to know that Jesus wanted to suffer and die for your sins?

Session 4 Thursday



Before you read...

- God sent the prophets to tell His people about Jesus, but not just His birth. The prophets told about other events in Jesus' life.
- Today we will read from the book of Zechariah, another prophet who told many things about Jesus. He wrote his book about 500 years before Jesus was born.

Read Zechariah 9:9

 What two words does Zechariah use to describe the King (Jesus) in this verse?

What will the King be riding on when He comes?

At Christmastime we think about Jesus' mother, Mary, riding on a donkey to Bethlehem, but Jesus also rode on a donkey when He was an adult. Do you know when He rode on a donkey? (You can find the answer in Matthew 21:1-7.)



Before you read...

Yesterday we read that the king asked Daniel to explain the meaning of the writing on the wall from the mysterious human hand.

Daniel tells the king that he will tell him what it means, but that he does not want the rewards the king offered him.

Daniel then tells a story about the former king, Nebuchadnezzar and how he did not listen to God's warnings. We are going to skip that part and read what Daniel says about the current king, Belshazzar. (You can read it in verses 18–21 if you want.)

Read Daniel 5:22-24

In verse 23, Daniel lists three things that King Belshazzar did wrong. What are they?

Who did Daniel say sent the hand who wrote the message?

Remember, the king was terrified when he saw the hand writing on the wall. How would you feel if you all of a sudden saw a hand writing on your wall?

Session 3 Friday

Before you read...

Today we finally get to learn what the hand wrote on the wall and what it means!

Even when Daniel explained the message, it can still be kind of hard to understand. Here is another explanation of what Daniel said the message meant:

- God was going to end King Belshazzar's time as king.
- King Belshazzar did not follow God's rules.
- Even King Belshazzar's family will not rule anymore.
- > The kingdom will be split between two other kingdoms.

Read Daniel 5:25-31

The Bible does not tell us what King Belshazzar said after Daniel explained the message. What do you think the king said or did?

What happened to King Belshazzar that very night?

God punished the king because he was not humble and did not honor God. We have a better king, Jesus, who always honored God and chose to humble Himself and die on the cross for our sin. Jesus made a way for you to be with God forever. How can you honor God today?



Before you read...

- God sent prophets to tell His people about the coming King, His Son, who would rule forever. The prophets told many details about Jesus a long time before He was born.
- There are many places in the book of Isaiah that point to Jesus, but he was not the only prophet who told about Jesus.
- Today we will read from the prophet Micah who told where Jesus would come from. Micah wrote this message about 700 years before Jesus was born.

Read Micah 5:2-4

- Where does verse 2 say the ruler will come from?
- Where was Jesus born? (You can find the answer in Luke 2:4-7.)

Look at verse 4. How far will His greatness reach?

Session 4 Tuesday



Before you read...

- This month we have learned that God is in all places at all times and is always with His people.
- God sent prophets to tell His people that He promised to send Immanuel—God with us—Jesus.
- This week we are looking at five different places in the Old Testament where prophets told of God's promise to send Immanuel.

Read Isaiah 9:6-7

- What names does Isaiah call Jesus in verse 6?

Before you read...

We have been learning that even when God's people sinned and went into exile, God was still with them.

- Just like God promised His people that their exile would end, He promised He would send a King to rescue them from their biggest problem: sin.
- It is almost Christmas! As we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth, we are going to look at five places in the Old Testament where prophets tell of Jesus' coming.

Read Isaiah 7:13-14

- Look at verse 13. What family or house will Jesus come from? In other words, Jesus is the great great great (many greats) grandson of King who?
- In verse 14, what two things does Isaiah tell us about Jesus?
- Immanuel means, 'God with us.' Isaiah said these things more than 700 years before Jesus was born! And now, more than 2,000 years later, God is still with us! What is one way you know God is with you?
