Who have been key influencers in your life and why?

My parents and grandparents: They demonstrated Jesus' love to me and prayed relentlessly for me; Craig Nichols: Shared Jesus with me in college and God used him to direct my heart back to Jesus; Jen (my wife): Her patience and selfless love when her husband has been inconsiderate and selfish. Tommy Nelson: Helping me see the big picture of God's redemptive work and how Jesus is shadowed (i.e. anticipated) in the Old Testament.

What do you love most about ministry in the local church?

Preaching the Scriptures; Discipling leaders; Connecting and shepherding people

What about ministry in the local church frustrates you?

I can get frustrated when there is not a clear vision or strategy. I enjoy creating vision and strategies, but get frustrated when we as a leadership team only talk and never choose to implement.

How would you describe your ideal work environment/culture?

I will thrive in an environment where I can use my teaching and preaching skills on a regular basis, shepherd and disciple key leaders and have an outlet where I can connect with guests and others disconnected from church.

How would you describe your leadership style?

I am highly relational and work best in teams. I am not an authoritarian leader. I do not lead out of position, but out of influence. This can only happen out of relationship that is built with time and trust. I prefer to come alongside or underneath other leaders. As a leader, I will certainly come with opinions and direction, but am willing to listen and lean on other leaders for cooperative ideas.

Describe your understanding of "team" or "collaboration" when it comes to ministry environments where paid staff and volunteers work together.

I often use "alongside and underneath" as language for how I choose to lead. I do not lead by "coming over the top." In other words, I do not lead from position. I am intentional about getting to know each leader and coming alongside them in order to encourage and equip them to take the next step forward.

I would consider myself a strong leader with confidence, but I know I have gaps and so I am comfortable having other leaders alongside me to help shape vision, culture and strategies to reach people who do not know Jesus and to equip God's people for ministry in their homes, neighborhoods, and the workplace and beyond.

What current voices, leaders and resources shape your life and ministry most?

I read widely and listen to various types of pastors (some of which I would not fully endorse their content, but appreciate their clarity in communication). I have appreciated Dr. Don Sunukjian as he is leading my doctorate program. Tim Keller, John Piper, Tommy Nelson, and various other theologians have influenced me. I enjoy reading Schreiner, Beale, Ross, Wallace, Moo, etc.

PERSONAL CONVICTIONS

Evangelism within the congregation and the community

I believe the Church is primarily for the believer—for the equipping of the saints (Eph. 4:12). However, I also believe we should communicate biblical truth in a manner that those who have not submitted their lives to Jesus can understand the Scriptures and hear the Gospel. The Church is a place where we should invite our friends and family so that they can encounter a community that looks different from the world, but more importantly, they can encounter the God of our community. I believe the Church should reach the community around them. Over the past 10+ years of ministry, I have noticed that the majority of American churches have defaulted to programs in order to reach their community. Programs are beneficial and have their place, but they typically serve more as a "come and see" methodology over that of a "go and tell." I'd like to see the Church be more balanced in this area and strategic in creating a culture that is intentional about pursuing those within our community and neighborhoods who are disconnected and far from God.

Ministry outreach to city and community

I am a proponent of serving in a way where relationships can be formed. I am by no means opposed to passing out water or serving meals to the poor and needy, however I think our hearts are stirred to compassion and movement when meaningful relationships can be formed while we serve (and with whom we serve).

Church growth

I firmly believe that when we devote ourselves to biblical teaching (God's Word), fellowship and prayer (in both a corporate and smaller group settings), God will continue to add to the growth of His church (Acts 2:42-47). I believe the Gospel really is the power to transform a life so, when we are faithful to teach and proclaim the Gospel, God will draw people to Himself (Rom. 1:16).
