

Sunday, September 7

Monday, September 8

SESSION I



Before you read...

▶ We have learned how Solomon, King David's son, was a wise king. But Solomon also sinned. Today, we will learn that He didn't obey God's commands, and his heart was turned to worship idols. Because of this, God said He would tear Solomon's kingdom away from him and give it to his servant. But God also said He would not do this while Solomon was alive.



Read | Kings 11:9-13

Why did the Lord become angry with Solomon?
What was the Lord's punishment for Solomon?
Challenge: What promise did God make David that is mentioned here in verses 12 and 13?

SESSION I

Tuesday, September 9



Before you read...

- ▶ We have learned how Solomon, King David's son, was a wise king. But Solomon also sinned. Yesterday, we learned that He didn't obey God's commands, and his heart was turned to worship idols.
- God told Solomon he would tear the kingdom away from him except for one tribe, for the sake of David. God had promised David that a member of his family would always be on the throne. Today, we will read about Jeroboam, a servant of Solomon.

Wednesday, September 10

SESSION I



Before you read...

- Yesterday, we read that God tore the kingdom away from Solomon because he and the people of Israel worshiped idols and did not walk in God's ways. Not long after this, Solomon died. His son, Rehoboam, became king.
- We also read that Jeroboam would be king over 10 tribes of Israel. Before he became king, Jeroboam went to Rehoboam and asked him to lighten the harsh labor that had been given to them.

SESSION I



Before you read...

➤ Yesterday, we read that King Rehoboam asked the elders who served his father, Solomon, for advice on how to answer Jeroboam's request. Before he became king, Jeroboam went to Rehoboam and asked him to lighten the harsh labor that had been given to them.

Before you read...

- Last week, we saw how the kingdom of God's people was divided into two parts. The Northern Kingdom was ruled by Jeroboam and called Israel. The Southern Kingdom was ruled by Rehoboam and called Judah.
- This week, we will learn more about the kings of Israel. We'll see that Israel's kings did evil in God's sight and worshiped idols. We will begin by reading what the prophet Ahijah had to say to Jeroboam.

Tuesday, September 16

SESSION 2



Before you read...

- This week, we are reading about the kings of Israel. We'll see that Israel's kings did evil in God's sight and worshiped idols.
- Yesterday, we read that Jeroboam did more evil than all who lived before him by making idols of metal and worshiping other gods.

Before you read...

- This week, we are reading about the kings of Israel. We'll see that Israel's kings did evil in God's sight and worshiped idols.
- Yesterday, we read that the family of Jeroboam will be cut off because of the sins Jeroboam caused the people of Israel to commit.
- Today, we are going to read from 2 Chronicles 13 to learn more about why God was so angry with Jeroboam. 2 Chronicles and 1 Kings talk about the same events of Israel's evil kings.

- After Ahijah called out Jeroboam, there was a great battle between Israel and Judah. Israel lost and the Lord struck Jeroboam dead.



Memory Verse: 1 Kings 8:60

"May all the peoples of the earth know that the Lord is God. There is no other."



Before you read...

- Last week, we learned that the wicked kings of Israel led the people to worship false gods. This week, we will see how another king of Israel, Ahab, also led the people to worship idols. Ahab did more evil than all of the kings before him. He did not follow any of the Lord's commands. Ahab and his followers worshiped a false god called Baal.
- God told Elijah to meet Ahab and his followers and challenge them to find out who was the true God.

Monday, September 29



Before you read...

- Last week, we saw how King Ahab led the people of Israel to worship the false god Baal. But God used the prophet Elijah to show Ahab that He is the One True God.
- This week, we'll learn how King Ahab continued to disobey God and act wickedly. Ahab was an evil king, and God eventually brought judgment on him. We will start reading when King Ahab is at war with King Ben-Hadad of Aram.

Why did the Lord want to give Ahab victory?
Who won the battle?

Tuesday, September 30

SESSION 4



Before you read...

- This week, we are reading how King Ahab continued to disobey God and act wickedly. Ahab was an evil king, and God eventually brought judgment on him.
- Yesterday, we read that the Lord gave Ahab victory in battle because He wanted Ahab to know that the Lord is the One True God. Unfortunately, King Ahab continues to act on his own power instead of the Lord's.

Wednesday, October 1



Before you read...

- This week, we are reading how King Ahab continued to disobey God and act wickedly. Ahab was an evil king, and God eventually brought judgment on him.
- Yesterday, we read that Ben-Hadad and the Aramaens attacked Israel again, but the Lord delivered them again because He wanted Ahab to know that He is the One True God. Even though Israel won, Ben-Hadad, king of Aram, escaped.

Did Ahab accept the deal with the enemy? How do you think the Lord felt about that?

Thursday, October 2

SESSION 4



Before you read...

- Yesterday, we read that Ben-Hadad offered Ahab a deal to return some land to Ahab if Ahab let Ben-Hadad live. Because of this, the Lord sent a prophet to tell Ahab he would die. (You can read that in 1 Kings 20:35-43.)
- We are going to read about another time when King Ahab disobeyed the Lord. Ahab wanted something that didn't belong to him.

- Ahab was a disobedient, greedy, and stubborn king who refused to lead Israel in the ways of the Lord. Today, we will see how the wicked ways of Ahab were coming to an end as God would bring judgment on him.
