Several years ago, I was serving alongside others on a mission trip in London. We were prayer walking one afternoon in an area that was full of mosques, and protesters were in the streets. As we walked and prayed for God to move in that area, we began hearing shouts from a group of men across the street: "Kill the Christians! Kill the Christians!" They were pointing at our little group while shouting those words.

Needless to say, that was an incredibly frightening moment for our group. We hurried and left the area immediately. But as we later reflected on what had happened, we realized that, from an eternal perspective, we really had no reason to be afraid. We've been told in the Bible that those who follow Jesus will face times of persecution, and through it all, God is with us.

From the message Jesus gave to the church at Smyrna, we will learn that we can stand strong in the face of fear. We truly are rich in the grace of God.

DAILY DEVOTIONS



The 7 Arrows of **Bible Reading**



Day One **HEBREWS 3:12**

The author of Hebrews is referring to the generation of Israelites who came out of Egypt and who had seen God's power and love demonstrated in supernatural ways, but who died in the wilderness because they failed to live faithfully in obedience. At times, we are tempted to do these same things. We experience God's power in our lives, but we soon forget and fall back into old patterns of complaining, selfishness, and disobedience. God clearly says that when we disobey, it's because we lack faith and our hearts are evil. Instead, we must continually keep a close watch on our lives and on our hearts, making sure that we choose every day to live in obedience from hearts of faith.

Why do you sometimes struggle to believe God?

Why is unbelief and disobedience so serious? What are the consequences?

Day Two HEBREWS 3:13a



Because we are tempted to believe, it is absolutely necessary that we encourage others and receive encouragement in our own lives. The kind of encouragement the author of Hebrews is talking about is not simply helping us to feel good about ourselves, but our being encouraged, or even challenged, to press on in our faith. Culture will continually tempt us to love the things of the world or to walk away from Jesus. But with the encouragement of Christian brothers and sisters, we are more likely to continue faithfully pursuing Jesus.

Day Three **HEBREWS 3:13b**

Satan is a liar, and sin works by deceiving us into believing it offers something that will bring us happiness and meaning. Sin is often compared to a snare (James 1:14; Heb. 12:1). Here's the picture—a fish sees a tasty worm and swallows it, only find there's a hook buried inside. Because it can't get off the line, the fish is dragged to shore and loses its life. Sin tempts us to believe it brings happiness, but once we've experienced the initial pleasure, we're trapped, dragged deeper and deeper into pain and misery, ultimately leading to our destruction. Continual accountability and encouragement from Christian friends helps to keep us from falling for sin's lies.

Day Four HEBREWS 3:14a

Day Five HEBREWS 3:14b

Jesus calls us to resist sin's lies and, instead, to follow Him faithfully. At times, it can be easy to get excited about specific matters of faith. For instance, new believers are often enthusiastic about sharing their faith. Or maybe your student pastor preached a sermon about how important it is to read our Bibles, and you committed to reading through the Bible in a year. But many times, after we've started well, life gets busy, we get distracted or discouraged, and we don't follow through as well as we'd like. True followers of Jesus don't live by faith for only a little while, but all our lives. The Israelites who came out of Egypt saw God's power, but they got distracted and fell away-and they died in the wilderness. If we are to enter into God's eternal blessings, we must follow Jesus every day of our lives.

As mentioned before, we often start well, but fail to follow through. The author of Hebrews teaches that it's important to hold on to the reality that we had at the beginning. The Hebrew Christians had grown up as faithful Jews, but when they heard the gospel, they committed their lives to Jesus and began following Him faithfully. If we are to remain steadfastly devoted to Christ, we must continually remind ourselves (and others) of the gospel. Jesus came to earth, lived a perfectly righteous life, and even though He didn't deserve it, He died on the cross to pay the price for our sins. It wasn't easy, and along the way, Jesus was tempted to walk away (Matt. 26:39). But He didn't! He steadfastly walked the path to which the Father had called Him. Jesus was devoted to the Father—and to us. We must devote ourselves steadfastly to Him.
