Growing in Christlikeness is accomplished as we act intentionally to pursue Christ and as God works in our lives

Several years ago, my family brought a 9-year-old girl out of a vulnerable situation and into our home. Within a month of her moving in, we went on our yearly vacation, which involved a lot of time at the pool. However, there was a problem. Our daughter had never been swimming, and she was terrified!

It took me at least an hour to get her into the water, and another three days before she would even attempt to swim. Despite my describing the fun she would have and promising that I would make sure she was okay, she simply wasn't willing to take a chance. She had experienced so many broken promises before that she wasn't willing to trust me.

By the end of the week, however, I finally convinced her to take the risk and give swimming a try. More importantly, I convinced her to trust me. Today, she loves to swim, and all summer long, we can't get her out of the pool.

Chances are, you've been hurt by broken promises. Maybe you've even come to the same conclusion as our daughter—that people aren't trustworthy. The truth is that people will let us down. However, Jesus never will. He is faithful to fulfill His promises, and if we will trust Him, Jesus will make sure that we are okay.

Day One **MATTHEW 10:16a**

The Bible speaks over and over of God's people as sheep. Sheep are seen as vulnerable because they have no system of defense, such as claws or fangs. Further, they are dependent upon a shepherd's leading them, and without someone to follow, sheep will go astray. When Jesus sent His disciples out as sheep among wolves, this was an indicator that they would continually encounter people who would seek to do them harm. They would be despised, rejected, and persecuted. Further, they would be tempted to stray from Jesus and His teachings. However, this knowledge helped protect them against unrealistic expectations.

Day Two **MATTHEW 10:16b**



Serpents are often seen as a representation of cunning or shrewdness. For followers of Jesus, it is important that we know how to balance speaking boldly with avoiding unnecessary danger. It is wise to emulate the best qualities of serpents, specifically, that they are crafty and are good at staying clear of danger. At the same time, we must be like doves, careful not to be deceptive, but maintaining our innocence and purity at all costs. In order to fulfill Jesus' mission for His followers, we must be both shrewd and innocent.

Day Three **MATTHEW 10:17-18**

Many times, when people come to faith in Jesus, they believe He will immediately and magically make their lives better, solving all their difficulties and blessing them with health and wealth. However, this wasn't the message Jesus communicated to His followers. Instead. He told them they'd be unjustly arrested, beaten, and locked up. Even worse, it was their fellow Jews-the people of God-who would do this to them. However, when the disciples testified to their innocence, they would have the opportunity to share about Jesus with people in all positions of authority. They would certainly endure the worst kinds of difficulties, but these very hardships would provide them the opportunity to demonstrate the difference Jesus made in their lives.

Day Four **MATTHEW 10:19-20**

Christians are called to share our testimonies and clearly proclaim the gospel to those who don't know God. However, this can be intimidating for many reasons, and we're often hesitant to tell others about Jesus. Maybe it's because we don't know how to start a conversation. It may be that we fear rejection. Or perhaps we're worried that we'll face questions for which we don't have answers. Whatever the case, Jesus told His followers that they didn't need to worry—the Holy Spirit would be with them, and if they'd devoted themselves to Jesus and His Word, the Spirit would guide in giving their testimony. Today, this same Spirit works in us, and when we devote ourselves to following Jesus and sharing the gospel, He will speak through us, drawing people to Himself.

Day Five MATTHEW 10:21-22



To follow Jesus doesn't always lead to a happy and healthy earthly life. Instead, sometimes following Christ will lead to great loss in our lives. To be a Christian means to live as Jesus lived, and Jesus' words and actions led to His being rejected, arrested, beaten, and crucified. And we should expect the world's rejection, as well. After all, if the world hated Him, it will hate us, too. However, if we endure, living faithfully in pursuing Jesus all the days of our lives, we can know that we will be saved from the destruction that's coming upon the world and worldly people. Even though the Christian life can be difficult, following Jesus is always worth it.
