Sunday, March 2

Session 1 Monday



Before you read...

- A long time ago, we read about God's promise to Abraham to give his family some land, the land of Canaan. Abraham believed and trusted God to keep His promise. Many generations later, God's people are right on the edge of the Promised Land. Moses, God's chosen leader, was not able to lead the Israelites into the land and has died.
- This week, we will see how God's promise to bring His people into the land of Canaan came true. God gave Joshua courage to lead the Israelites, and they crossed the Jordan River.



Read Joshua 1:1-9

What phrase did God tell Joshua three different times in this passage?
What were the people supposed to "be careful to obey?"
What would happen to the people if they did obey?

Session 1 Tuesday



Before you read...

- God's people are right on the edge of the Promised Land. Moses, God's chosen leader, was not able to lead the Israelites into the land and has died. God gave Joshua courage to lead the Israelites into the land of Canaan.
- Yesterday, we read that God instructed Joshua and the Israelites to be strong and courageous and to obey all of God's laws and commands. God also promised to be with the Israelites wherever they went.

Session 1 Wednesday



Before you read...

- Yesterday, we read that God commanded the priests to carry the ark of the covenant into the Jordan River and stand in the water.

- Yesterday, we read that as soon as the priests' feet touched the water, it stopped flowing and the whole nation of Israel crossed the Jordan River on dry ground.

What special instructions did God and Joshua give those 12 men?
What did the stones mean?

Session 1 Friday



Before you read...

- God's people are right on the edge of the Promised Land. Moses, God's chosen leader, was not able to lead the Israelites into the land and has died. God gave Joshua courage to lead the Israelites into the land of Canaan.
- Yesterday, we read that God told Joshua to choose 12 men—one for each tribe of Israel— to take a stone from the middle of the river and place them in the land of Canaan with the Israelites.



JOSHUA CROSSES THE JORDAN



Session 2: Conquering Jericho Joshua 2, 6



Sunday, March 9

Why can we trust God?

Jesus taught about God and His kingdom. He taught that all Scripture is about Him.

Memory Verse: Psalm 24:8

"Who is this King of glory? The Lord, strong and mighty, the Lord, mighty in battle."

Session 2 Monday



Before you read...

- Last week, we read that God dried up the Jordan River so that the Israelites could cross over into the Promised Land. When they arrived in their new land, they came to the city of Jericho with huge walls and an army ready to defend their city.
- God promised Joshua that Jericho, and everything in it, would be given over to the Israelites. Joshua and the Israelites trusted God to defeat Jericho.



Read Joshua 2:1-7

Whose house did Joshua's two spies hide in?
Why did they need to hide?
Challenge question: Was the owner of this house an Israelite?

Session 2 Tuesday



Before you read...

- When the Israelites arrived in their new land, they came to the city of Jericho with huge walls and an army ready to defend their city. But, God promised Joshua that Jericho, and everything in it, would be given over to the Israelites. Joshua and the Israelites trusted God to defeat Jericho.
- Yesterday, we read that Joshua sent spies into the city of Jericho to look over the land. The spies hid in the house of a woman named Rahab, who was not an Israelite.



Read Joshua 2:8-14



Before you read...

- When the Israelites arrived in their new land, they came to the city of Jericho with huge walls and an army ready to defend their city. But, God promised Joshua that Jericho, and everything in it, would be given over to the Israelites. Joshua and the Israelites trusted God to defeat Jericho.
- Yesterday, we read that Rahab knew the Lord had given the land to the Israelites and the people of Jericho were melting in fear because of the Israelites. The spies promised Rahab that she and her family would be protected as long as they all stayed in Rahab's house during the battle.



Read Joshua 6:1-7

What instructions did God give to Joshua to defeat Jericho?
Do you think blowing horns and shouting is strong enough to knock down huge, thick walls of a city?
This seems like a strange plan. Why could the Israelites trust God's plan?

Session 2 Thursday



Before you read...

Yesterday, we read that God instructed the Israelites to march around the city of Jericho once each day for six days. Then on the seventh day, they were to march around seven times and blow the trumpets and shout. I wonder what the Israelites thought of these strange instructions for destroying a city!



Read Joshua 6:8-19

Did the Israelites follow God's instructions? How do you think the people inside the city felt when the Israelites were marching around it?
Who were the only people in Jericho who were to be saved?
What were they supposed to do with all of the silver, gold,
bronze, and iron?

Session 2 Friday



Before you read...

Yesterday, we read that the Israelites followed God's strange instructions exactly. They marched around for seven days and only shouted on the seventh day. Let's see what happened next!



Session 4 Wednesday



Before you read...

- Last week, we read how Joshua and the Israelites trusted God to defeat Jericho. But before the Israelites could possess all the land of Canaan, they needed to face many more enemies and conquer many cities. Just like at Jericho, God fought for the Israelites.
- Yesterday, we read that the Gibeonites asked Joshua to save them from the 5 kings who joined up against them. The Lord told Joshua not to be afraid and that he would defeat the enemy.


The Sun Stands Still Joshua 10

Once they entered the land, the Israelites had to face many enemies, but God always fought for the Israelites. Last week, we read that God's people finally had rest from war.
- This week, we will read about Joshua's final message to God's people. We'll see that Joshua was growing old and would soon die. But before his death, Joshua reminded the Israelites to worship and obey God.

Session 5 Tuesday



Before you read...

- Yesterday, we read that Joshua reminded the people of God's faithfulness to keep His promises and fight for the Israelites, drive the enemies out of the land, and give the Israelites the land.



Read Joshua 23:6-13

What instructions did Joshua give the people in verses 6-8?
What will happen if the Israelites turn away from God and follow the false gods of the enemies?
How can we, today, remember God's faithfulness and obey His commands?

Session 5 Wednesday



Before you read...

- This week, we are reading about Joshua's final message to God's people. Joshua was growing old and would soon die. But before his death, Joshua reminded the Israelites to worship and obey God.
- Yesterday, we read that Joshua told the people to be strong and to obey all of God's commands. If the people did not obey, then God would no longer drive out the enemies and they would be a trap for the Israelites.



Read Joshua 23:14-16

How many of God's promises failed?
What is the main thing in verse 16 that Joshua warns the people not to do?
Why should we still today worship God alone?

Session 5 Thursday



Before you read...

- Yesterday, we read that God kept ALL of His promises. And the people were to be sure to worship God alone and NOT bow down to or serve other gods.
- In chapter 24, Joshua reminds the people of all God has done clear back to the time of Abraham. If you want a challenge, read all of Joshua's words in chapter 24!



Read Joshua 24:11-13

Who is speaking in this passage?
Who won the battle against all those enemies?
What things did God give the Israelites that they did not earn on their own?

Session 5 Friday



Before you read...

- This week, we are reading about Joshua's final message to God's people. Joshua was growing old and would soon die. But before his death, Joshua reminded the Israelites to worship and obey God.
- Yesterday, we read that God defeated the enemies and gave the Israelites land, cities, vineyards, and olive groves that they did not earn.



Read Joshua 24:14-18

How did the people respond to Joshua's speech?
Why do you think, before he died, that Joshua reminded the Israelites of all that God had done for them?
We have the same choice today. Will you obey and worship
God alone or live "me first, my way?"
