WHAT TO EXPECT ON SITE

REGISTRATION:

If you are local to the area, we welcome you to serve for the day. Please contact a Volunteer Coordinator at 828-588-5711 at least 24 hours in advance to be scheduled to serve. You will then be given directions regarding arrival at our host location.

Each volunteer and/or team member, including youth, should complete all Volunteer Forms online at www.spvolunteer.org. A hardcopy version of these forms are available onsite.

A brief safety orientation is required before volunteering on a Samaritan's Purse site. The orientation is roughly 25 minutes and is only necessary the first day. Volunteers may work a half day or full day (morning, afternoon, or both).

You will be assisting homeowners impacted by heavy storm damage in the area. This could involve cleaning up

tree/yard debris, salvaging and/or removing personal belongings, and tarping roofs. After completing orientation, you will be paired with an experienced team leader to go out to work.

YOUTH: Volunteers **must** be 14 years of age or older. Youth, ages 14 and 15, must be accompanied by a parent or be a part of a youth group. Youth, ages 16 and 17 must be accompanied by an adult 21 years of age or older. In addition to the online forms all youth must complete:

- Youth Volunteer Release and Waiver of Liability: (All volunteers under 18) complete and present at check-in.
 - Parent signature is required.
 - If the parent will not accompany the youth, <u>the</u> <u>parent signature must be notarized</u>.

WHAT TO BRING

While on worksites, please wear appropriate clothing. A Samaritan's Purse T-Shirt will be provided upon arrival.

- Bagged Lunch and Water (lunch break on site)
- A hat, long pants, sturdy work boots or shoes with thick soles
- Work Gloves, Safety Glasses, and Hearing Protection
- A mask or bandana and hand sanitizer

All tools and recommended safety/protective equipment will be provided by Samaritan's Purse. If you would like to bring a tool belt and small hand tools, make sure they are well marked.
