SESSION I



Before you read...

Tuesday, January 7

Session 2: The Golden Calf Exodus 32; 34



Why do we need to be saved?

People are sinful and cannot save themselves.

Memory Verse: 1 Samuel 2:2

"There is no one holy like the Lord. There is no one besides you! And there is no rock like our God."



Before you read...

- ▶ Last week, we learned that God set His people apart and called them to be a holy nation. He gave His people commandments because He loved them and wanted them to live in a way that honored Him.
- ▶ When we left off last week, Moses was up on the mountain speaking to God and receiving the commandments while the people were waiting at the bottom of the mountain. This week, we will learn what the Israelites did while they were waiting for Moses.

SESSION 2



Before you read...

Yesterday, we read that Moses interceded for the Israelites. This means he stepped in and asked God not to let His anger burn against them. Moses asked God to remember the promise He gave to Abraham to make his family greater than the number of stars in the sky. And God did not destroy the people, even though they were worshiping an idol.

Friday, January 17



Before you read...

- Yesterday, we read that Moses was very angry with the Israelites. He burned the golden calf, ground it to powder, put it in the water and made the people drink it! Then Aaron lied to Moses and said the calf just appeared out of the fire!
- Even though Moses and God were very angry with the people, Moses stepped in and asked God to forgive the people.





God had always been with His people, leading them and guiding them. God led His people as they traveled in the wilderness. He led them by a cloud during the day and by a fire at night. But now, God needed a special place to dwell with His people. God gave instructions to Moses and invited the people to build a special tent called the tabernacle.

Before you read...


- Yesterday, we read about the ark that went inside the tabernacle. God had the people make many, many more things. If you are interested in all of the things they made, read Exodus 37-40.
- Today, we are going to skip all the way to the end to see what happened when all of the parts of the tabernacle were complete.



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

Sunday, Janaury 26

Monday, January 27



Before you read...

- Last week, we read about when God's people built the tabernacle, a special tent where God could dwell with His people. The tabernacle was also a place where God's people worshiped Him. The priests made sacrifices for the sins of the people in the tabernacle.
- God commanded the Israelites to be holy and worship Him alone. God takes sin seriously, and to be right with God, our sin must be forgiven. This week, we will read about how God gave the high priest very specific instructions about how to offer sacrifices for the sins of the people.

Even though it is hard to read, it is so important to know the instructions God gave the Israelites in the Old Testament. It all points to why we need Jesus and why He was the perfect sacrifice for us once and for all!



Read Leviticus 16:11-14

Wednesday, January 29



Before you read...

- Just so you know, the rest of the chapter talks a lot about sacrifices, killing animals, blood and things we just don't do anymore. Even though it is hard to read, it is so important to know the instructions God gave the Israelites in the Old Testament. It all points to why we need Jesus and why He was the perfect sacrifice for us once and for all!
- Yesterday, we read that Aaron had to sacrifice the bull for his own sin offering and for his household. He took incense and burning coals along with the bull into the 'Most Holy Place.' A curtain separated the rest of the tabernacle from the 'Most Holy Place.'

Thursday, January 30

SESSION 4



Before you read...

- Just so you know, the rest of the chapter talks a lot about sacrifices, killing animals, blood and things we just don't do anymore. Even though it is hard to read, it is so important to know the instructions God gave the Israelites in the Old Testament. It all points to why we need Jesus and why He was the perfect sacrifice for us once and for all!
- Yesterday, we read that Aaron had to sacrifice one goat for the sins of the people. Then, Aaron would lay his hands on the other goat and confess all of the wickedness and rebellion and sin of the Israelites on the goat's head.



Read Leviticus 16:23-28

What does the man have to do after he releases the goat?
Do you think it was easy or difficult for the priest to follow God's instructions?

Friday, January 31



Before you read...

Yesterday, we read that Aaron had to take off his special clothes and bathe right after he left the 'Most Holy Place.' The man who released the goat also had to change clothes and bathe. God took sin seriously!!




Read Leviticus 16:29-34

- When were these special sacrifices to be made?
- How often were these sacrifices to be made?
- We all disobey God's commands and sin. We cannot save ourselves and need to be forgiven of our sins to be made right with God. God instructed the Israelites to sacrifice animals to demonstrate the forgiveness and removal of sin. Because people continued to sin, the priest would offer sacrifices regularly for his sins and the sins of the people. We no longer need a priest to sacrifice animals for our sin. God provided a better way for our sins to be forgiven through His Son, Jesus. Those who trust Jesus, the perfect and final sacrifice for sin, receive forgiveness and are made forever clean. Trusting in Jesus gives people new, clean hearts that desire to worship God and live for Him. Write a prayer to Jesus thanking Him for His sacrifice.
