Message: Christ's Return & Reign

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Memory Verse: Revelation 4:11 NIV

"You are worthy, our Lord and God, to receive glory and honor and power, for you created all things, and by your will they were created and have their being."

The goal of these questions is to foster meaningful discussion and to encourage participants to reflect on God's Word to lead to heart transformation. Feel free to modify or expand upon these questions based on the dynamics and needs of your Small Group.

Big Idea: Those who turn to Jesus have life and those who refuse will be eternally judged

Read Revelation 19

- Have you ever experienced a loud voice of a vast multitude (ex. Sporting Events)? Describe what is required to create that level of volume. How do you think that experience will compare to what is described in verses 1-4?
- Is worshiping God in song something that comes naturally to you? If not, reflect and share what you think are the barriers to allowing you to worship freely with joy and exuberance. For those whom worship comes naturally, share about how this practice has positively impacted your spiritual walk.
- Verse 13 refers to Jesus as the Word of God. Read John 1:1-5, 14. What comes to your mind when you hear the term "the Word" in a religious context? Why do you think Jesus is referred to as the "Word" in the Bible? According to John, what role did Jesus have in creation? What role will He have in it's judgment? What noteworthy parallels do you see between these verses in John and how we see in Revelation?
- With the verses of 11-16, four names of Jesus are shared. Faithful, True, Word of God, King of kings and Lord of Lords. What other names are given to Jesus, where are they found, and what do they mean? Which name holds the greatest



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significance to you and why?

- In the Old Testament, earthly rulers use the phrase 'king of kings' to describe their absolute authority (Ezra 7:12; Daniel 2:37). The term 'Lord of lords' is used in the Old Testament to refer to God the Father (Psalm 136:3). By Jesus having the name King of kings and Lord of lords, what is being expressed? Why are these truths important to the Christian faith? How can they be used to share the Gospel with others?
- Scripture regularly testifies that God does the heavy lifting for us. This theme is depicted again in verses 11-21 with the rider on the white horse wielding the only weapon. As followers of Christ, we are expected to follow and be obedient. How are you at relying on God's strength instead of your own? What does it look like to trust in God's guidance and power rather than relying on your own efforts?

Read Revelation 20

- Satan has great power to dissuade people regarding the truth about God. People's natural tendency is to be wayward. We see this in the Garden of Eden and again in this chapter. Where in your walk do you feel pulled to waywardness? How do we guard ourselves against the lies of Satan? How can we help others remove the fog that Satan brings?
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
